

PROPOSITIONS

Proposition 1- School Budget

Shall the following resolution be adopted, to wit:

RESOLVED that the Board of Education of the Southern Cayuga Central School District, Counties of Cayuga and Tompkins, New York, be and hereby is authorized to expend the sum of **\$16,515,886** and levy the necessary tax therefore.

Proposition 2- Bus Purchases

Shall the following resolution be adopted, to wit:

RESOLVED that the Board of Education of the Southern Cayuga Central School District, Cayuga and Tompkins Counties, New York, is hereby authorized to pay the cost of the purchase of school buses, including incidental expenses in connection therewith, at a maximum estimated cost of not exceeding **\$318,500**, and that said amount or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be raised by the levy of a tax upon the taxable property of said School District and collected in annual installments as provided by Section 416 of the Education Law; and, in anticipation of such tax, obligations of said School District shall be issued.

Proposition 3– Library Support

Shall the following resolution be adopted, to wit:

RESOLVED that the Board of Education for the Southern Cayuga Central School District is hereby authorized to raise the tax levy from \$30,000 to **\$33,000** for the support and operation of the **Aurora Free Library** and the **Hazard Library**, and such sum shall be split equally and paid annually to the trustees of said libraries.

Proposition 4– Capital Reserve Fund

Shall the following resolution be adopted, to wit:

RESOLVED, that the Board of Education of the Southern Cayuga Central School District is hereby authorized to establish a capital reserve fund to be used to finance in whole or part the cost of acquisition, construction or reconstruction of District buildings and grounds and of other capital projects in accordance with Education Law section 3651, in an ultimate amount not to exceed **\$1,500,000**. The fund shall have a probable term of five (5) years. The Board of Education is authorized to pay into the fund (1) in the 2009-10 school year and annually thereafter funds of the District in an amount determined by the Board not to exceed \$300,000 per year, (2) state aid reimbursement to the District on account of capital projects to the extent determined appropriate by the Board for the purposes of the fund, and (3) such other monies as the voters may direct.

BOARD OF EDUCATION ELECTION
