With new things being added to the school’s budget we the students ask “Where’s the air”? With finals coming up students pile up in the library cracking open books just to get in some last minute study time but most students cant stand being in there due to the lack of air conditioning. It’s bad enough the students have to sit in a room that’s to hot to read or work in but it’s bad for the books also.

Our sympathy goes out to the staff working in the library that must stay in the library all day. We asked Mrs. Sedorus how the heat in the library affects her during summer, she replied “at the end of summer working on the hottest days it makes us miserable.” When asked how hot it gets in there she replied “too hot!.” To keep cool they turn off all the lights that they have switches for. We asked Mrs. Shurtleff what she thought air conditioning could do for her and she said “it would be much easier to work.” As bad as it is for them to suffer in the library, the book damage can get much worse.

The damage caused by the heat could be molding of the books, deterioration, fading of the colors, and they can get brittle. Mrs. Sedorus said that there have already been cases of molding books in the library. Along with the books in the library there are approximately 20 computers; the heat from the computers raise the temperature in the library about twenty percent. Air conditioning controls the spread and growth of mold on books. “Excessive moisture and lack of air movement are deadly to the paper used in most modern books.”

In our library alone there are about twenty-two thousand books. If each book cost about twenty dollars to replace that would cost the school four-hundred forty thousand dollars. Getting an air conditioner would cost a lot less then paying for a new collection of books, and even more to buy original and antique books. Therefore, saving the school more money that they would for the 20,000 books they already own. But if they ignore the problem that’s in front of them facing, the books won’t last much longer. Please...think of the children.
